While reading a book on the Civil War recently, I came across a powerful piece of trivia that truly struck me—and I wanted to share it with you.

*It was an April morning, just three days after General Robert E. Lee had surrendered to General Ulysses S. Grant. Southern troops, led by General John B. Gordon—a Mason—were marching in columns toward the northern troops to formally stack arms and fold their flags.*

*Suddenly, a shifting of arms was heard. General Gordon looked up in alarm, unsure of what was happening. But there was no threat—only a profound gesture. General Joshua Chamberlain had ordered his Union troops to assume the position of honor: “Honor answering honor.” In response, Gordon’s Confederate troops snapped to attention and returned the honor.*

*It was the first symbolic act of healing after four years of war and the loss of over 618,000 lives.*

*And it was a Mason who gave that command.*

Moments like this remind me how deeply Masonic values—honor, respect, and reconciliation—are woven into the fabric of history. I'm proud to be a Mason and even more proud to stand among you, my Brothers.
